SCHLOSSBERG, SCHLOSSBERGBAHN (SCHLOSSBERG FUNICULAR) AND SCHLOSSBERGTURM (SCHLOSSBERG TOWER)
Freiburg's Schlossberg offers spectacular views across the city. Head up this historic hillside to discover traces of the past and sample some delicious food and drink. From the Stadtgarten (Municipal Park), the Schlossbergbahn funicular takes you up the hillside in just three minutes. At 456 m, the Schlossbergturm tower offers for magnificent views stretching all the way to the Vosges mountains on clear days. FREIBURGER MÜNSTER (CATHEDRAL)

“OF OUR LADY”

Construction period: from around 1200 to the mid 16th century
Largely in the Gothic and late Gothic style.
Tower: 116 metres (incl. weather vane)
Staircase: 209 steps to the tower room

Important sights include:

- West tower – “The most beautiful tower on Earth” according to art historian Jacob Burckhardt
- The bells
- Entrance hall adorned with carved figures
- Altarpiece by Hans Baldung Grien
- Historic windows

WHY IS THE CATHEDRAL A “MÜNSTER” AND NOT A “DOM”?

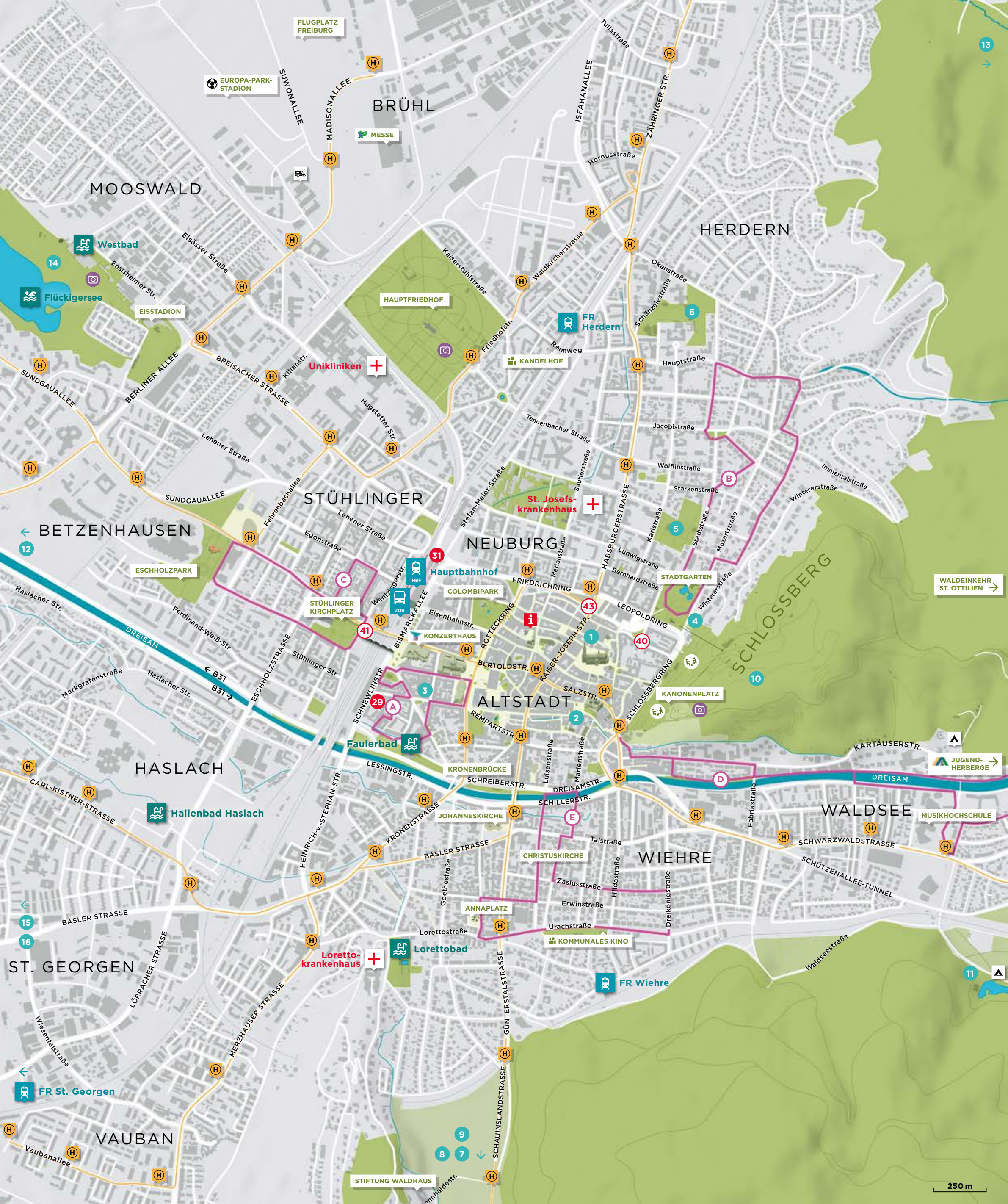
“Dom” is the standard modern German word for a cathedral (the official seat of a bishop). However, the Freiburger Münster did not become a cathedral until 1827 because the bishop's seat was in Konstanz until this time. The term “Münster” (“minster”) has continued to be used despite the fact that Freiburg is now a bishop's seat.

- ## DISCOVER FREIBURG ON FOOT
- Distance: 2.5 km; duration: approx. 60-90 minutes
-
- The route starts on Rathausplatz (Town Hall Square), right at the heart of the city. The Altes Rathaus (Old Town Hall) 1 stands out for its red façade and is home to the Tourist Information Office, so head inside if you need anything or have any questions. Next door, you can see the Neues Rathaus (New Town Hall) 11, which was used by the University of Freiburg until the end of the 19th century. The building that now hosts Freiburg's municipal leaders once contained anatomy classrooms and a polyclinic. Directly opposite is Martinskirche (St. Martin's Church) 26, which dates back to around 1300 and served as a monastery church for the neighbouring Franciscan monastery until 1783.
- The statue on the square's fountain is of Friar Berthold Schwarz. Legend has it that the alchemist discovered gunpowder by chance. In front of the fountain, ornate mosaics depicting the coats of arms of Freiburg and its twin cities are embedded into the ground of the Rathausplatz. All across Freiburg's Old Town, streets and shop entrances are adorned by colourful mosaics made from pebbles from the Rhine – so don't forget to look down!
- Head left past Martinskirche and stroll along Franziskanerstraße until you reach the Haus zum Walfisch (Whale House) 5 with its magnificent late Gothic doorway and oriel. Built by Emperor Maximilian's treasurer general, it was home to the famous humanist Erasmus of Rotterdam from 1529 to 1531.
- From here, cross Kaiser-Joseph-Straße and head left towards the Basler Hof 2. Built between 1494 and 1496, it is one of the city's most important secular buildings and today houses the Regional Council. Once called the "Große Gass" ("Wide Street") in the Middle Ages, Kaiser-Joseph-Straße used to host Freiburg's city market. Now often referred to as the "Kajo", the street, with its post-war arcades, serves as Freiburg's main shopping street and boulevard.
- Turn right at the Basler Hof and you'll catch your first glimpse of the Münsterplatz (Cathedral Square), the beating heart of the city. Farmers and traders sell their goods here at the Münstermarkt (Cathedral Market) from Monday to Saturday, so take the opportunity to try a "Lange Rote" (long red sausage), have a glass of wine or enjoy one of the other specialities on offer.
- Rising up from the middle of the square is the imposing Freiburg-er Münster (Cathedral) 27 with its 116-metre-high spire. Built between 1200 and 1513, it has survived numerous wars virtually unscathed and features magnificent sights such as the impressive pediment reliefs in the vestibule, historic stained-glass windows and the altarpiece by Hans Baldung Grien.
- On the south side of the cathedral, the red façade of the Historisches Kaufhaus (Historical Merchants' Hall) 6 will catch your eye. Embellished with Habsburg sculptures and coats of arms, it was built between 1520 and 1532 to oversee the city's market and served as a customs, trade and financial centre. Take your time to stroll across the Münsterplatz and explore the surrounding historic buildings. You could also sit and relax in one of the many inviting cafés and restaurants on the square.
- The route continues past the Alte Wache (House of Baden Wines) 1 and the Alte Münsterbauhütte (Old Cathedral Workshop) 9 and on to Herrenstraße, where you'll discover the Erzbischöfliches Ordinariat (Archiepiscopal Ordinariate) 5, which is one of the most outstanding examples of late historicism in Baden. Having turned left into the narrow Münzgasse, you'll find yourself on one of the most beautiful streets in Freiburg, Konviktsstraße. It was a bustling street full of artisans in the Middle Ages and, today, its charming façades and quaint boutiques make it perfect for strolling and browsing. Continue walking until you reach the Schwabentor (Swabian Gate) 12. Constructed in the mid 13th century, it is the younger of Freiburg's two surviving city gates, and its façade depicts the legendary tale of the Swabian man who once tried – and failed – to buy the city. The area around the Schwabentor boasts a number of restaurants serving Baden specialties. Germany's oldest inn, Zum Roten Bären 15, is of particular interest. From the Schwabentor, it's worth taking a detour to one of the city's green spaces. Simply cross the Schwabentorsteg footbridge and walk up the hill for just a few minutes until you reach the Kanonenplatz (Cannon Square) on the Schlossberg (Schlossberg Hill) 16, where you will be rewarded with a spectacular view of Freiburg.
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- The walk through Freiburg's Obere Altstadt (Upper Old Town) with the Gewerbekanal waterway, Gerberau and Fischerau alleyways and the Insel (Island) is worth every step you take over the cobblestones! Known as the "Schneckenovorstadt" ("Snail Suburb"), this charming district is popular for visiting galleries, browsing independent shops, while away some time in a picturesque café, or spotting the stone crocodile in the waterway. Follow the Gewerbekanal until you reach the lively Augustinerplatz (Augustinian Square), where you'll find the former monastery of the Augustinian Hermits. Built in 1300 and reconstructed in the baroque style in the early 18th century, it houses what is arguably Freiburg's most beautiful museum, the Augustinermuseum 16. Back in the Middle Ages, the Obere Altstadt was Freiburg's artisanal quarter. Today, it's a place where you can take in the city's almost Mediterranean charm, dip your toes into one of the rivulets to cool off, and simply watch the world go by. Feeling relaxed and refreshed, continue walking until you reach the city's oldest intact defensive watchtower, the Martinstor (Martin's Gate) 7. Dating from the 13th century, the tower was occasionally used as a prison and was later heightened and renovated in the early 20th century.
- Having walked through Martinstor, you can see Bertoldsbrunnen (Bertold's Fountain) 39 at the centre of the shopping street. Sitting atop the fountain is a statue dedicated to Freiburg's founders from the Zähringer dynasty. Instead of walking towards the fountain, turn left into Niemensstraße, where you'll find yourself in the vibrant student area behind the university with its many international snack bars, pubs and cafés.
- Continue along Niemensstraße until you reach Bertoldstraße. The Universitätskirche (University Church) 37 is on the opposite side of the street. To its immediate right is the Alte Universität (Old University) 35 with the Uniseum (University Museum) 22, which provides fascinating insights into local student life and the history of the venerable Albert Ludwig University of Freiburg, which was founded by Albert VI in 1457. Turn left and you'll soon reach the Platz der Alten Synagoge (Old Synagogue Square) 10, which is named in memory of the synagogue that stood here until it was destroyed in 1938. The fountain traces the outline of the former synagogue. To the left of this expansive square stands the architecturally striking Universitätsbibliothek (University Library) 36. Freiburg's theatre 32, which was built in the neo-baroque style in 1905, can be seen to the right of the library.
- Begin your leisurely return to the route's starting point by walking along Rotteckring. Before turning right into Turmstraße, pause to take a look at Colombipark 14 on the opposite side of the road and marvel at the Colombischlössle sitting on top of the hill. Built for the Countess de Zea Bermudez y Colombi between 1859 and 1861 in the English neo-Gothic style, the mansion is today home to the Archäologisches Museum (Archaeological Museum) 17. The last section of the route runs along Turmstraße and takes you past the guild house of the Breisgau Jesters, where the Fasnetmuseum (Carnival Museum) 19 is located. Opposite the museum, in the courtyard of the Altes Rathaus, stands the city's oldest administrative building, the Gerichtslaube (Old Court House) 4, built as a council chamber in 1303. At the end of Turmstraße, you will find yourself back on Rathausplatz, which is where the tour began.
